It is being informed that **UGC** (University Grants Commission) has developed a Portal called **UTSAH** (Undertaking Transformative Strategies and Actions in Higher Education). This Portal is expected to effectively track and support the implementation of the National Education Policy, 2020 and its strategic initiatives across the country's Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) on different thrust areas.

I regard of this, following activities have been either started or implemented at GLA University, Mathura.

Thrust Area 1: Multidisciplinary and Holistic Education

- We offer multidisciplinary programs such as BA LLB, BCoM LLB, etc., and are continually developing new programs.
- Students of GLA University are registered on the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) portal, and the University uploads the required data through the provided link.
- The University has a provision of Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit (MEME) in line with the guidelines
 of the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020).
- The University has adopted the national credit framework for courses such as BBA, BCom, BA English, BA Economics, BSc Physics, BSc Chemistry, BSc Maths, BCA, and BSc Biotech.

Thrust Area 2: Digital Empowerment and Online Education

- The University offers BBA, B.Com, MBA, MCA, and BCA programs online through its Centre for Distance and Online Education.
- GLA University allows students to opt for courses from approved online platforms like NPTEL, SWAYAM, etc., with their marks considered for credits.

Thrust Area 3: Skill Development and Employability

- The University has 32 MoUs with various industries and focuses on internships and placements through its training and placement cell.
- Following UGC guidelines, GLA University appoints Professors of Practice from industry.

Thrust Area 4: Research, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship

 The University has a well-established Research and Development cell with tasks including creating a conducive research environment, encouraging collaboration, and facilitating access to research resources and funding.

Thrust Area 5: Capacity Building of Teachers for Quality Education

• The University organizes capacity-building programs for faculty members to enhance teaching and assessment skills.

- The University has prepared the draft of Institutional Development Plan (IDP), which is available on the website.
- A Grievance Redressal Cell for students is in place, following UGC guidelines.

- GLA University is accredited with NAAC A+ with a score of 3.46.

- Institute of Pharmaceutical Research is ranked within the top 100 bands in NIRF with rank 54 and University is in top 50 in India in Innovation.

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
