Agenda Item-2: To brief about academic reform and teaching learning process

It was suggested to organize regular training sessions for faculty to adapt to new technologies. The need to incorporate more project-based learning and industry collaborations was emphasized.

Agenda Item-3: To review the research outcome, patent, project, publication.

The research outcomes from various departments were presented. It was noted that several research initiatives have shown promising results, contributing significantly to both academic knowledge and practical applications. Members emphasized the importance of aligning future research with emerging trends and societal needs.

The IQAC reviewed the academic and non-academic accomplishments of students over the past year. It was noted that participation in cultural events, sports, and technical fests has been robust, with students winning accolades at both national and state levels. The IQAC discussed ways to further encourage student participation by providing more support for student clubs, organizing inter-departmental competitions, and recognizing outstanding performers.

The IQAC reviewed the outcomes of previous academic audits. It was noted that the audits had successfully identified key areas for improvement, leading to significant enhancements in curriculum, teaching methodologies, and departmental infrastructure.

A need was identified to align the curriculum more closely with ICAR guidelines. This includes updating course content, incorporating more practical and field-oriented training and preparation of SSR for accreditation.
